4 🔳 Culture War

- *The phrase "Culture War" is a metaphor used to claim that political conflict is based on sets of conflicting values.
- *These values come from our worldview, which is the framework we use to interpret the world around us and interact with it.
- *So the passionate political conflict we see today is not an argument over issues, it is actually a conflict between two competing worldviews and their corresponding values.
- •Judeo-Christian vs. Secular Humanist
- *Conservative (Right) vs. Progressive (Liberal/Left)

5 🔳 Culture War

- *"There is a religious war going on in our country for the soul of America. It is a cultural war, as critical to the kind of nation we will one day be as was the Cold War itself."
- •In addition to criticizing "environmental extremists" and "radical feminism," he said public morality was the defining issue of our time.

6 🔳 Culture War

•In his book, Culture Warrior, O'Reilly asserts that the United States is in the midst of a "vicious culture war" between "traditionalists" and "secular-progressives".

7 Definitions

- Traditionalist
 - *Is someone who believes that the United States is, more often than not, a noble country that has made some mistakes.
 - *Believe in the family unit and place emphasis on spirituality, selflessness, and charitable causes.
- Secular Progressives
 - •Individuals who reject the Judeo-Christian worldview.

*Want to social engineer a brave new world void of what they believe is repressive social norms and values.

10 My Definition
