TEXT

# My dear brothers, take note of this: <u>Everyone</u> should be <u>quick</u> to <u>listen</u>, <u>slow</u> to <u>speak</u> and <u>slow</u> to <u>become angry</u>, for <u>man's anger</u> does <u>not</u> bring about the <u>righteous life</u>

- Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can <u>save</u> you. (James 1:21 NIV)
- ▶ Do not merely <u>listen</u> to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. (James 1:22 NIV)

TEXT

#### **SCRIPTURE**

- Anyone who <u>listens</u> to the **word** but does <u>not</u> do what it says is like a man who <u>looks</u> at his **face** in a **mirror** and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. (James 1:23-24 NIV)
- ▶ But the man who looks <u>intently</u> into the **perfect law** that gives freedom, and continues to do this, <u>not forgetting</u> what he has heard, but **doing it** – he will be blessed in what he does. (James 1:25 NIV)

#### **SCRIPTURE**

- If anyone considers himself religious and yet does not keep a tight rein on his tongue, he deceives himself and his religion is worthless. (James 1:26 NIV)
- ▶ Religion that God our Father accepts as <u>pure</u> and <u>faultless</u> is this: to <u>look after orphans</u> and <u>widows in their distress</u> and to <u>keep oneself from being polluted by the world</u>.
  (James 1:27 NIV)

### INTRODUCTION

- Most of us remember learning to drive a car as an challenging process involving taking a <u>written test</u> and nervously <u>navigating the road</u> with a state trooper or driving instructor tracking our every move.
- Eventually, all of that <u>practice</u> and <u>instruction</u> was rewarded with a **driver's license** and its accompanying sense of freedom.
- But what if you could skip all that hassle and just "YouTube it" instead?

#### INTRODUCTION

- That's what an 8-year-old boy in Ohio did on one recent Sunday night.
- Our young innovator had a problem: mom and dad had fallen asleep early, and the boy and his 4-year-old sister were <a href="https://www.ncbe.num.
- The golden arches were a mile and a half away too far for a walk in the dark. So the boy did what any selfrespecting Gen-Z kid would do when confronted with a problem.
- He looked up "How to drive a car" on YouTube, emptied his piggy bank, then bundled his sister into the car and headed out for a cheeseburger.

#### INTRODUCTION

- Police said later that the boy obeyed all the traffic laws, didn't hit a single thing, and drove "effortlessly" through town as though he had been driving for years all because he watched a few minutes of video instruction and then did precisely what it said to do.
- Our pint-sized adventurer seems to have grasped early on what many of us grasped much later in life.
- That on the internet, someone somewhere has <u>created a video</u> to show you how to do what you want to do or fix.



INTRODUCTION

**TEXT** 

- Whether it's a repair for your home or your car, how to put on makeup, learning self-defense or making dinner, all you need to do is look it up on the world's most popular video site and soon you'll be an expert yourself.
- There are millions of these <u>tutorial</u> <u>videos</u>, most produced by average people who have learned a skill and simply want to share it.



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TEXT

#### INTRODUCTION

- It's the crowd sourcing of expertise that makes it possible for the most mechanically inept person to fix a faucet, or a maker of microwave mac and cheese to become a gourmet chef.
- Of course, all this instruction depends on the viewer's willingness to experiment and put the information into practice.

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▶ Without that, it's just another waste of time.

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TEXT

#### **HOW DO WE STAY FAITHFUL**

- ▶ People in the **ancient world** obviously didn't have YouTube.
- Most of their learning was accomplished by watching someone model the activity in question face to face or by receiving a letter from a distant instructor.
- ▶ So Apostle James wrote this letter to Jewish Christians who were caught up in the **social tensions** of the mid-first century, where <u>outbreaks of violence</u> and <u>insurrection</u> were taking place in Jerusalem a conflict that would culminate in the Jewish revolt of A.D. 66-70

HOW DO WE STAY FAITHFUL

- In fact, the whole **Roman world** was dealing with <u>unrest</u>, including <u>economic problems</u>, <u>food shortages</u>, and the <u>rapid</u> <u>turnover of Roman emperors</u> that led to an **erratic government policy** toward Christians, Jews and others.
- The problem before the church in this time of uncertainty can be summed up something like this: "How do we remain a faithful Christian community in the midst of this time of trial and temptation?"
- ▶ James wrote to <u>encourage</u> his brothers and sisters and to give them some <u>instruction</u> on how to navigate in difficult times.

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TEXT

#### HOW TO #2 - FAITHFUL NESS WILL OFTEN BE CHALLENGED OR TESTED

- For James, times of testing was not something that was arbitrary or strange, but an opportunity for us to use our faith, so that it can grow.
- As the Apostle James says, Consider it **pure joy**, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops **perseverance**. (James 1:2-3 NIV)
- ▶ Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. (James 1:4 NIV)

TEXT

#### **HOW TO #1 - FAITHFULNESS MUST BE PRACTICED**

- ▶ The **epistle of James** reads like a series of <u>random tutorial videos</u> on the Christian life, but in this section James made clear that no amount of <u>instruction</u> <u>matters unless it is put into practice</u>.
- If James wanted the church to become **experts** not only in <u>hearing</u> the instruction, but <u>doing</u> the instruction as well.
- As James says, Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him. (James 1:12 NIV)
- James saw the **current situation** as a time of <u>testing</u> for the Christian community, but also an <u>opportunity</u> to demonstrate **faithfulness**.

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TEXT

#### HOW TO #3 - DISCIPLINE IS NOT FUN BUT YIELDS MUCH FRUIT

- But as many of us know discipline or having to face trials is not fun. In fact, it can be very stressful.
- ▶ The writer of Hebrews agrees, No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. (Hebrews 12:11 NIV)
- Nevertheless, every **Christian** goes through discipline (trials).
- If fact, again, according to Hebrews 12, if you are not disciplined, then you are **illegitimate children** and <u>not</u> true sons.

THE CHALLENGES OF DISCIPLINE

The purpose of discipline is not to make us <u>sad</u> or <u>unhappy</u> but to make us <u>completely dependent on God</u> where we <u>perfect our walk</u> with the Lord and <u>grow spiritually</u>.

As it says in Hebrews 12...

- ▶ God disciplines us for our good, that we may <u>share</u> in his holiness. (v. 10)
- Later on ... it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it. (v. 11)

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TEXT

#### LIVING VIDEOS OF FAITH

- ▶ The world and younger Christians need a witness of what God can do through those who trust him.
- While words are helpful, they need a lot of life examples to watch for themselves.
- We can supply these to them, if we ourselves <u>persevere</u> through trials ourselves by **practicing the faith**.
- ▶ As the scriptures say, Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial. (James 1:12 NIV)

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TEXT

#### THE CHALLENGES OF DISCIPLINE

- Again the purpose of God's discipline is not to make us sad, but to help us **exercise our faith** so that it can grow through use.
- Again as James says, Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. (James 1:4 NIV)
- You see when our **faith** <u>is strong</u> and we're not lacking anything, we're equipped to become a **witness** <u>of what God can do through</u> those who trust him.
- In other words, we can start <u>uploading</u> **youTube videos** on <u>how to live the Christian life that can help many</u>.

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TEXT

#### FRUSTRATION AND ANGER

- ▶ However, as we all know, a lot of people get <u>frustrated</u> when they go through trials.
- In fact, they get more than frustrated, they get **angry** and for some reason or the other, look for someone to blame.
- According to James, we are to accept the word planted in us, and turn from wrath and do good.
- Why? because . . . man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires. (James 1:20 NIV)

**CONCLUSION** 

So then, when you're going through **trials** and you don't know what to do and your emotions are getting the best of you, what should you do?

Like watching self-help videos on youTube, **examine** the lives of your brother and sisters in Christ <u>you respect and follow their example</u>.

• Chances are the **wisdom** they have was learned by <u>watching the</u> <u>right people in their lives</u>.

Together we can both be a **source** of grace that not only <u>strengthens</u> each other but the entire body of Christ.

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TEXT

**CONCLUSION** 

- This world of ours is a very frustrating place in which to live.
- Never before in my life have I seen more **moral confusion** than in this day and hour in which we now live.
- That is why we all need to step up and accept the word that has been implanted in us and respond to the trials around us with wisdom that is from above.
- ▶ What kinds of **wisdom** come from heaven?
- [It] is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. (James 3:17 NIV)

TEXT

**CONCLUSION** 

▶ If an 8-year old boy can learn to drive a car to get a happy meal, so we can as "babes" in Christ, learn to deal with trials by watching those who are mature in the Lord.

Remember this, when we <u>react</u> to trials in **godly ways**, <u>we grow</u> spiritually and so does our faith.

In fact, we become a **living epistle** (letter) <u>read</u> or <u>viewed</u> by others.

▶ We become a source of grace that can help people have the peace of God on their lives.

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TEXT

#### CONCLUSION

- We therefore have an **obligation**. It is not an obligation to the wisdom that is from below and is of the devil, but to the <u>wisdom that</u> is from above.
- In other words, all of us have an opportunity to become a **living** video—an "how to" in Christ, on how to apply **God's wisdom** in a world that is full of trials.
- ▶ We owe it to each other and we owe it to our children and grandchildren, if not to the whole world.
- So then, let us be a **witness** of what God can do through those who trust him with all their heart, soul, strength, and mind. AMEN
