The film is the story of his amazing rescue and recovery. It recalls the words of tonight's text: *"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?"* (Is. 43:19).

Home Cell Group Ministry

Our home cell group ministry is at the heart of our church. It is where we seek to "flesh out" our faith so we can be the church and true disciples of Jesus Christ—carrying out His word.

At this time, we have three home cell groups. Both our Men's and Women's Groups meet on Thursday evenings and our multi-generational group meets on Sunday evenings.

- Our Men's Group is watching a series on the Book of Judges by J.D. Greear. The purpose of this series is to strengthen our faith and guide our application of God's Word.
- The Ekklesia Ladies Group is doing the Bible study, "Adored by the God who sees Me." Hagar, Abraham and Sarah's servant, was the only person in the Bible who was able to give God a name, based on how He intervened in her life. She called Him "El Roi," meaning, "You are the God who sees me" (Genesis 16:13), which is the theme for our bible study.
- Our Multi-generational group is currently being taught by Pastor McCowan.
