# INTRODUCTION



- How many here tonight are wondering where your <u>next</u> meal will come from?
  - Vegetables from your garden?
- Groceries you haul home from the store?
- Something on the restaurant menu that looks good to you?
- Until recently, these were about the only choices most of us had, meal-wise.
- Until, that is, the advent of meal-kit delivery services.

## SCRIPTURE

- Then the LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have <u>rolled away</u> the reproach of **Egypt** from you." So the place has been called **Gilgal** to this day. (Joshua 5:9 NIV)
- On the evening of the fourteenth day of the month, while camped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, the Israelites celebrated the Passover. (Joshua 5:10 NIV)
- The day after the Passover, that very day, they <u>ate</u> some of the **produce** of the land: <u>unleavened bread</u> and <u>roasted grain</u>. (Joshua 5:11 NIV)
- The manna stopped the day after they ate this food from the land; there was no longer any manna for the Israelites, but that year they ate of the produce of Canaan. (Joshua 5:9–12 NIV)

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# INTRODUCTION



- Once the domain of those trying to lose weight, gourmet meal kits have become a hot little corner of the food industry.
- Trading under names like Blue Apron and HelloFresh, these companies offer subscribers a box of fresh ingredients each week that they can use to whip up their own gourmet meals at home.
- Open box. Follow recipe. Dig in.

## INTRODUCTION



- Rapid delivery services like UPS and FedEx are key to the success of these enterprises.
- So is an ingenious plastic sack of frozen goo that sits inside a shiny foil "space blanket," transforming the humble cardboard carton into a single-use disposable cooler.
- Once you have a <u>subscription</u> to one of these services, the **food cartons** show up <u>each week</u> like clockwork.
- You don't have to order them although most services do allow for some substitution options. The boxes just come.

## BREAD FROM HEAVEN



- One day, long ago, the **Hebrews**, recently freed from slavery in Egypt and at the point of starvation in the wilderness, woke up to find <u>bread from heaven!</u>
- They called it manna, and like the Blue Apron boxes, it came on a regular basis not once a week, but every morning! This went on for years!
- But without fail, each daily delivery included a fine, flaky substance that was like coriander seed, white, and the taste of it was like wafers made with honey (Exodus 16:30).

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# BREAD FROM HEAVEN



- There was no shipping box, no freezer pack, no insulating liner.
- The manna arrived on the ground fresh, like shimmering morning dew.
- Its <u>shelf life</u> was limited to **one day**, so there was <u>no stockpiling</u> it for the future.
- But who among them was concerned about that, when the Lord delivered a fresh supply each day with double rations on the day before the Sabbath?

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#### BREAD FROM HEAVEN

- It's remarkable how often the **Lord** sends us just <u>what we need</u>, <u>when we need it</u>.
- It was true for the ancient Israelites then, and it remains true for us today.
- God's provision is always there to help His people on their way to the Promised Land.

## BREAD FROM HEAVEN

- Some Bible scholars have tried, over the years, to figure out what manna was.
- There are all kinds of theories.
  - Some say it was the <u>secretions</u> of certain insects;
  - others, tree sap;
  - still others, a sort of edible fungus that sprang up during the night.
- The bottom line is, nobody really knows. To the authors of the Bible, it's a miracle which is probably all we need to know.

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# GIFT OF THE ELVES



- There's a substance in J.R.R.Tolkien's fantasy trilogy, The Lord of the Rings, that functions very much like biblical manna.
- Tolkien, of course a professor of ancient literature at Oxford — was a <u>deeply</u> religious man.
- When faced with the problem of explaining what food the hobbits Frodo and Sam would find to eat as they crossed the land called Mordor...
- Tolkien invented a kind of manna they carried with them, a gift of the elves.

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#### GIFT OF THE ELVES



- It's called lembas, a magical bread.
- As durable as hardtack, but tastes far better.
- Lembas cakes would keep for many months, as long as they stayed wrapped in a certain magical leaf.
- Even a bite or two was enough to sustain a weary pilgrim for a whole day.

#### GIFT OF THE ELVES



- However, **Lembas** was a food for the <u>righteous</u>.
- Those who are evil like the dark and twisted soul, Gollum find the taste of lembas offensive.
- Gollum refused to eat the lembas cake even when faced with <u>starvation</u>.

## DIVINE PROVIDENCE

- What we're talking about here tonight, in <u>theological terms</u>, is called "providence."
- It's not a word you hear so often anymore unless you're talking about the capital of Rhode Island.
- In fact, the city of **Providence, Rhode Island** was given its name by **Roger Williams** and his followers who were being run out of the Massachusetts Bay Colony and into the wilderness found a place of provision.
- This was a <u>place</u> where not only they could serve God, but also have <u>plenty of</u> game in the forest and fish in the streams, which was like **manna** for them.

## DIVINE PROVIDENCE

- Has anyone ever had times when you we felt trapped by dire circumstances?
  - Lost your job.
  - Failed relationship.
  - Sickness, or injury.
  - Locked your keys in the car.
- But then, we find God is close at hand, guiding our circumstances, and we discover that we have what we need after all.


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# DIVINE PROVIDENCE


- Such experiences are our manna moments.
- They may <u>not</u> always seem so at the time but, later on, with a little distance to reflect back on the **situation**, a pattern of God's loving care emerges.
- We come to see the **providential hand of God** <u>active</u> in our lives in the most remarkable ways.
- When that happens, the place we once imagined to be wilderness turns out to be a place of blessing after all.

# THE STORY OF JOSEPH




- There is no other story of God's Providence at work than what we find in the story of Joseph.
- Sold into slavery by his <u>jealous</u> brothers, Joseph finds himself in Egypt.
- While rising to the place of honor in a high ranking Egyptian's household, he is **betrayed** and ends up in prison for a crime he didn't commit.

# THE STORY OF JOSEPH



- Due to his ability to interpret dreams and overall wisdom, Joseph rose to a place of importance in Egypt—managing all of Pharaoh's affairs.
- This included the <u>distribution of</u> <u>grain</u> as both Egypt and Canaan were going through a **great famine**.
- Which by the way, brought Joseph's brothers to Egypt in search for food.


# THE STORY OF JOSEPH



- When Joseph's brothers come to purchase grain the very person they meet is Joseph.
- Joseph <u>recognizes</u> them but they don't recognize him.
- Accusing them of being spies, he sends them back to retrieve their little brother, which they reluctantly do.
- When they return with **Benjamin**, Joseph <u>plants a silver cup</u> among Benjamin's baggage and then <u>arrests</u> him for **stealing**.

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# THE STORY OF JOSEPH



- Joseph's brothers are overwhelmed with grief and Judah offers himself to be Joseph's slave.
- No longer able to control himself, Jospeh breaks down and weeps so loudly that everyone in his household compound hears him.
- Then he says one of the most
  profound statements in the Bible
  —especially as it relates to what his
  brothers did to him and to God's
  Providence.

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As for you, you meant evil against me,

# but God meant it for good,

to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today.

**GENESIS 50:20**

## GOD'S PROVIDENCE

- God knew a **famine** was coming so he <u>raised up</u> a son of Jacob by the name of Joseph to <u>bring salvation</u> to the whole earth.
- But this man was persecuted by his brothers and sold into slavery where in Egypt he was treated poorly even though he was <u>blameless</u> and <u>full of</u> integrity.
- However, because of his <u>wisdom</u> and <u>unique opportunities</u> that God provided, he gained the position of **second in command** and managed to <u>save both</u> <u>Jews and Gentiles</u>.
- In the same way, Christ was sent by God who now stands at the right hand of the father offering salvation to all men, both Jews and Gentiles.

GOD'S PROVIDENCE

- God's sovereign will always achieves its purpose.
- With this in view, not all **setbacks** are truly setbacks.
- God may be <u>repositioning</u> us to get us out of **potential problems** that are threatening our long-term well-being.
- In other words, God may mess with our comfort level at times so that he can <u>put us in a better position</u>, not only for us personally but for everyone around us.

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#### GOD'S PROVIDENCE

- Not to say or to imply all **problems** are ordered by the Lord.
- We live in a sin-cursed world where bad people do bad things and chaos in one form or the other often endangers our peace and well-being.
- Nevertheless, the Bible says, ...
- In all things, God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. (Romans 8:28 NIV)

## GOD'S PROVIDENCE

- In Romans 8:28, the Bible does not say,
  - all our circumstances work for our overall good, or everything that happens, happens for a good reason.
- Instead it says ...
  - In all things, God works <u>His grace</u>—especially to those who are called of God and carrying out His will.
  - Meaning that no matter what is happening in our life God's Divine
    Providence with an appropriate form of manna will come to help and sustain us.
  - Why? Because His eye is on the sparrow!

#### SUMMARY

- I don't know if you know this or not but **God** has a pretty good eye.
- He can see things that we can't.
- In other words, He can **anticipate** when we are going to need His grace and have it **ready** for us when we come to that point.
- In fact, the word providence is Latin for "to see ahead."
- This is why we do not need to babble like the pagans because our **heavenly father** already knows our needs. [See Matthew 6:7-8]

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SUMMARY

- Therefore I tell you, <u>do not</u> worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? (Matthew 6:25 NIV)
- Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? (Matthew 6:26 NIV)
- Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? (Matthew 6:27 NIV)

#### SUMMARY

- But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (Matthew 6:33 NIV)
- Therefore <u>do not</u> worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own. (Matthew 6:34 NIV)

## CONCLUSION

- Early in the spring of 1905, Civilla Martin and her husband were visiting Elmira, New York.
- There they made a <u>deep friendship</u> with a couple by the name of **Mr. and Mrs. Doolittle**, true saints of God.
- Mrs. Doolittle had been <u>bedridden</u> for almost twenty years.
- Her husband was an incurable cripple who had to propel himself to and from his business in a wheel chair.
- Despite their afflictions, they lived happy Christian lives, bringing inspiration and comfort to all who knew them.

- One day while they were <u>visiting</u> with the Doolittles, Mr. & Mrs Martin commented on their **bright hopefulness** and <u>asked</u> them for the secret of it.
- The Martins put their simple secret to a poem and later Charles Gabriel put it to music where it has become a Christian classic.
