

#### **SCRIPTURE**

- \* Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, <u>called</u> to be an **apostle** and <u>set apart</u> for the **gospel of God** the gospel he **promised** <u>beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures</u> regarding his **Son**,
- who, as to his **buman nature**, was a descendant of David, and
- who through the <u>Spirit of holiness was declared with power</u> to be the **Son of God** by his **resurrection** from the dead: **Jesus Christ our Lord.**(Rom 1:1-4 NIV)

## **SCRIPTURE**

- \* Through him and for his name's sake, we received grace and apostleship to call people from among all the Gentiles to the obedience that comes from faith. (Rom 1:5 NIV)
- \* And you also are among those who are called to belong to Jesus Christ.

  (Rom 1:6 NIV)

# CHRISTMAS GATHERINGS

- \* Who wants to be alone at Christmas?
- \* The simple answer is **no one**.
- Because of this, people all over the United States this month will be traveling far and wide to spend Christmas with family and friends.
- Regardless of whether the significance is religious or not, there is widespread agreement that "Christmas isn't Christmas" if you're all alone.



# CHRISTMAS GATHERINGS

- Some might argue that these gatherings are simply nice traditions that were developed to make the holidays different from the rest of the year.
- But according to social psychologists, we all, to varying degrees, have a need to belong with others.
- \* Most of us already know this.
- \* We are **social beings**, and no matter how <u>introverted</u> we may be, we **need** and **want** to be around others.



## JOHN DONNE

- In the seventeenth century, the great English poet and cleric John Donne wrote,
- No man is an island,
   Entire of itself.
   Each is a piece of the continent,
   A part of the main.



## BILLY JOEL

- \* Four hundred years later, **Billy Joel** wrote the lyrics to "I Don't

  Want to be Alone," saying,
- I don't want to be alone anymore, I was checking you out. I was just making sure, No, I don't want to be alone anymore.



#### ERIC CARMAN

- \*In his 1975 hit song "All By Myself," Eric Carmen writes, ...
- \*When I was young, I never needed anyone. Those days are gone Livin' alone, I think of all the friends I've known, But when I dial the telephone Nobody's home, All by myself.
- \* Don't want to be all by myself anymore All by myself.



## **TOGETHERNESS**

- Donne, Joel, Carman, and countless other poets, songwriters, philosophers, psychologists, and theologians agree: As a species, humans do not like being alone.
- \* We prefer togetherness and belonging.
- \* This is why we have a **need** to give affection to others and receive it from them in return.
- \*In fact, it's one of the forces that urges us to connect with others.



## HIERARCHY OF NEEDS

- \* According to Maslow's "Hierarchy of Needs," **belonging needs**, such as
  - friendship,
  - family, and
  - love ...
- \* Are the **first needs** to desire once our basic <u>physiological</u> and <u>safety</u> needs are met.
- \*In other words, we look for **fellowship** once our stomach is full.



## HIERARCHY OF NEEDS

- This is why in the garden, the Lord said, "It is not good for the man to be alone." (Gen 2:18 NIV)
- \* This is also why to be put "outside the camp" in the Old Testament and "shunned" in the New Testament was the Bible's preferred way to handle
  - rebels and
- those who <u>opposed</u> community standards of conduct.



# THE VALUE OF BELONGING

- \* We **belong** to our <u>spouses</u>, <u>families</u>, <u>friends</u>, <u>congregations</u>, <u>church groups</u>, <u>clubs</u>, <u>political parties</u>, and so on.
- Some of these associations are by birth and kinship, but many are by choice.
- \* To whom and to what we belong both affects who we are and reveal something about who we are.




#### **BELONGINGNESS**

- \* If I am in a **Small Group**, that says something about my <u>interests</u>, <u>values</u>, and <u>willingness</u> to participate in Bible Study and points to a **group** <u>of</u> <u>people</u> <u>with</u> <u>whom I identify</u>.
- \* But it also says **something** about what has <u>drawn me</u> to belong to this group in the first place.
- \* It may have been my **enjoyment** of <u>spiritual</u> <u>things</u>, but more likely, it was because someone in the Small Group <u>invited</u> <u>me to</u> <u>join</u>.



## INVITATION

- \* Belonging to Jesus is <u>always</u> by invitation, as Paul says in Romans, not by works, but by him who calls (invites). (Rom 9:12 NIV)
- \* This is also why the **Scripture** says it depends not on man's <u>desire</u> or <u>effort</u> but on **God's mercy**. (Rom 9:16 NIV)
- \* When Paul talks about those "called to belong," the emphasis should <u>not</u> be just on "belong" but on "called to belong."
- Paul understood God's call as a powerful word of invitation that offered a new life, a word that also made our response to the invitation possible.



#### BELONGING & RESPONSIBILITY

- \* Belonging, though, brings with it responsibilities.
- Our family expects us to show up at the family Christmas gathering, and if we don't, we'll
  have to answer to Grandma.
- \* When we "belong," there's a responsibility to ...
  - respect each other's roles,
  - uphold the group's values, and
- get along with each other for the good of the whole.
- \* This is why **love** is an obligation if there's to be any sense of **community** among us.

#### COVENANT

- \* A biblical word for this **sense of community** is the word **covenant**, which is applied <u>not only</u> to
  - to relationships between people but also
- to the **connection** between God and people.
- \* Covenant is a "belonging" word.
- \* We are **called** <u>to love God</u> and <u>love our neighbor</u> as we **love ourselves**.
- \* We may not think of those things as **obligations**, but they are, for there can be <u>no</u> full **community** or **covenant** with God without them.



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# BENEFITS OF BELONGING

- \* Belonging also brings significant benefits.
- \* We receive care from those to whom we belong.
- \* In our times of pain or need, <u>friends</u>, <u>relatives</u>, and <u>people from church</u> are usually **great sources** of <u>care</u> and <u>comfort</u>.
- \* In times of joy, those with whom we **fellowship** rejoice with us.
- \* This is why the **Scripture** says, *If one part suffers,* every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. (1 Cor 12:26 NIV)



# BENEFITS OF BELONGING

- Eric Speir, the author of the devotional guide, <u>Stubborn Faith</u>, mentions several advantages of belonging.
  - Provides us with needed accountability.
  - Helps us to get where we want to go faster.
  - Gives us an <u>outside</u> or <u>objective</u> **view**.
  - Helps us to see our blind spots in life.
- A place where others aren't afraid to <u>ask</u> us **hard questions**.



## SIN DESTROYS BELONGING

- \* Wanting to belong is a constant theme in all of our relationships.
- \* It is a **God-given desire**, yet, like all of God's good gifts, it can be <u>broken</u> and <u>distorted</u> by **sin**.
- \* When a relationship is **one-way** and is <u>only focused on self</u> or <u>what one</u> <u>can get out of the relationship</u>, it will soon be **destroyed**.



### SIN DESTROYS BELONGING

- \* The <u>same</u> can be said about our **relationship with God**.
- \* If our **sole reason** for serving God is
  - to **get** and not to give back by ministering to the **body of Christ**,
  - we will **damage** our relationship with each other and with **God**.
- \* Healthy relationships are ones where each party gives and receives and where no one takes advantage of the other.

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# ADVENT OF THE CHRIST

- \* The reason **Jesus** was born was to <u>die</u> <u>for our sins</u> so that we have **fellowship** with God.
- \* He came to that which was his own, but his own did <u>not</u> receive him. (John 1:11 NIV)
- \* Yet to all who <u>received him</u>, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become **children of God**. (John 1:12 NIV)



## CONCLUSION

- \* You did <u>not</u> choose me, but I **chose** (invited) you and <u>appointed</u> you to go and **bear fruit** fruit that will last. Then the **Father** <u>will give</u> <u>you whatever you ask in my name</u>. (John 15:16 NIV)
- \* In other words, Jesus invites us into fellowship with God and gives us the responsibility of belonging by bearing good fruit.
- \*If we are faithful, the **benefit** we'll have is answered prayer.



## CONCLUSION

- \* So then, if we <u>faithfully participate</u> in the **body of Christ** today, there is <u>no</u> good thing that God will withhold from us. (Psalm 84:11)
- \* Let us, therefore,
  - rejoice in our election,
  - fulfill our responsibilities, and
  - **expect** the <u>benefits of belonging</u> to God to flow into our lives.

#### FINAL WORD

- \* As it is written, But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. (1 Pet 2:9 NIV)
- \* And if we **belong to God** and take our <u>responsibilities seriously</u>, we can also expect Him to be faithful.
- \* As God has promised, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." (Heb. 13:5 NIV)
- \* For we belong to Him, and in Him, we live and have life.



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
