- Even then, it attracted
 widespread attention from
 both <u>American</u> and <u>European</u>
 racing teams.







Greatest Spectacle in Racing

- Billed as The Greatest Spectacle in Racing, the Indy 500 is considered one of the world's three most significant motorsports events.
- The **official attendance** is <u>not</u> disclosed by Speedway management, but
- the permanent <u>seating capacity</u> is more than 257,000 people, and
- infield seating raises the capacity to approximately 400,000.



The Valvoline Special

- My dad took me to my first Indy 500 in 1966 when I was 11 years old.
- The company he worked for sponsored a car called the **Valvoline Special**, driven by Eddie Johnson, who finished 7th.
- That year is remembered for having an **11-car pile-up** at the start of the race.
- Some drivers' names during that year's race were young Mario Andretti, Jim Clark, Parnelli Jones, Jackie Stewart, A.J. Foyt, Dan Gurney, Bobby, and Al Unser.
- The winner of the race that year was Graham Hill, who was a rookie.

Greatest Spectacle in Racing

- Today, during qualifications, many cars average speeds over 220 mph.
- The 3.5-liter turbocharged engines produce more than 650 horsepower.
- However, their fuel economy is only .769 mpg.
- The aerodynamics of the cars produces a downforce of 5,000 pounds.
- At speed, the **tire treads** <u>reach a temperature</u> <u>of 212°</u>.



1912 Indy 500

- But perhaps the <u>most memorable</u>, or at least inspiring, **Indy event** occurred during the second running at the Brickyard in **1912**.
- Something in that race caught the public's imagination and <u>helped</u> make the Indianapolis 500 the <u>great race</u> it is today.
- What happened <u>didn't</u> even involve the **winner**.
- It involved Ralph DePalma (Italian-American) and his riding mechanic Rupert Jeffkins.

1912 Indy 500

- At the start of the race, Ralph DePalma immediately took the lead and set a blistering pace.
- In fact, he led the race for **198** of the 200 laps.
- But with only a mile to go, something went horribly wrong with his Mercedes.
- The **engine stopped**, and <u>the car rested on the back straightaway</u>.
- Undaunted, DePalma and his riding mechanic exited their car and <u>started pushing</u>.







The Real Winner

- Even though **Joe Dawson** passed them to win the race, it didn't matter.
- The crowd gave him a standing ovation, and the story of **DePalma** pushing his car across the finish line swept across the nation and captured the fancy of everyone.
- From then on, the **Indianapolis 500** became an American tradition.
- DePalma went on to win the 1915 Indy 500 and, in his career, won over 2,500 races.

- "I am about to go the way of all the earth," he said.
- "So be strong, show yourself a man {have courage}, and observe what the LORD your God requires:
 - Walk in his ways, and keep his decrees and commands, his laws and requirements, as written in the Law of Moses, so that
 - you may **prosper** in all you do and wherever you go, and
 - that the LORD may keep his promise to me.
 - 'If your descendants watch how they live and walk faithfully before me with all their heart and soul, you will never fail to have a man on the throne of Israel.'"

Be Strong

- Ralph DePaima probably would have been <u>shocked</u> to learn before the race that he would have to <u>push his car across the</u> <u>finish line</u>.
- This is often how we approach life.
- We expect life to carry us along and give us wonderful things.
- ▶ We think that life is a **stream** <u>upon which we flow and go</u>.
- ▶ In other words, we think that life ...
- carries us along and;
- we don't need to <u>prepare</u> our hearts for **unexpected trouble**.
- However, this misguided assumption produces unrealistic exceptions, which can cause a "crisis of faith."

Be Strong

- How <u>surprised</u> we are ...
 - when sometimes things break down, and
 - we have to <u>climb</u> out of our **expectations**,
- <u>clamber</u> over our **dreams**, and
- step out onto the rough brick road of experience and start pushing.
- No doubt this is why David tells his son Solomon to "Be strong."
- Why? Because life is always full of unexpected setbacks that can tempt us to guit or stop trying.



Be Strong is a Commandment

- MOSES COMMANDS AND ENCOURAGES JOSHUA!
 - Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them,
 - for the LORD your God goes with you;
 - he will never leave you nor forsake you." (Deut 31:6 NIV)
 - Have I not <u>commanded</u> you? Be strong and courageous.
 - Do not be terrified;
 - do not be discouraged,
 - for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." (Josh 1:9 NIV)

Be Strong is a Commandment

- DAVID ENCOURAGES SOLOMON!
- Consider now, for the LORD has chosen you to build a temple as a sanctuary. Be strong and do the work." (1 Chr 28:10 NIV)
- THE APOSTLE PAUL TO THE CHURCH!
- Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be men of courage; be strong. (1 Cor 16:13 NIV)
- Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. (Eph 6:10 NIV)

Be Courageous

- Can you imagine how **DePalma** felt as his car came to a <u>grinding halt</u> on the speedway?
- He wasn't just a lame duck but a dead duck - no two ways about it.
- However,


- despite all odds,

Be Courageous

- David says to his son, "Be courageous."
- He didn't say, "Don't be afraid," because, as Mark Twain has famously observed, "Courage is not the absence of <u>fear</u>.
- It is <u>acting</u> despite it."
- In other words,
- courage is knowing what's around the corner and
- acting because you are <u>confident</u> that the **Lord** is with you.



Be Faithful

- David's <u>last</u> advice to his son was to
 - * "keep the charge of the LORD your God,
 - walking in his ways and
 - keeping his statutes,
 - his commandments,
 - his ordinances, and
 - his testimonies." (1 Kings 2:3)

Be Faithful

 God said something similar to **Joshua** when he began his leadership of the House of Israel: 22

- "This book of the law shall not depart out of your mouth; you shall meditate (or study) on it day and night so that you may be careful to act in accordance with all that is written in it. (Joshua 1:8a)
- For then you shall make your way prosperous, and then you shall be <u>successful</u>" (Joshua 1:8b).
- Being strong and courageous without being faithful to the word of God only means that our strength and courage are likely to be <u>misplaced</u> and <u>misdirected</u> or to come as something too little or too late.

According to the Apostle Paul,

- However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me — the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace. (Acts 20:24)
- ► I have fought the **good fight**, <u>I have finished the</u> <u>race</u>, I have <u>kept the faith</u>. (2 Tim 4:7)
- Do you not know that in a race, all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. (1 Cor 9:24)

- And what did David tell Solomon?
- Be strong
- Be courageous
- Be faithful to God
- David's advice to Solomon and our mandate as followers of Jesus Christ are not experienced in a poofy land of make-believe but in a nitty-gritty, 24/7, fast-paced world of unbelief, hostility, and anger.
- If we are to cross the finish line, we must be <u>strong</u>, <u>courageous</u>, and <u>faithful</u> to God because life is **full of trials**, and we may be **tempted** to <u>quit</u> when the <u>unexpected happens</u>.

Unexpected Trouble

- Examples of Unexpected Trouble
- A bad report from the doctor where you learn you have a serious health issue.
- A policeman knocks at the door with news about one of your children.
- > You are laid off from work, and times are hard everywhere.
- > You just learned that your spouse has been unfaithful.
- A close **friend** or **work associate** you trusted has just <u>stabbed</u> you in the back.
- The **stock market** has crashed, and now your <u>retirement fund is worth almost</u> <u>nothing</u>.
- You are called an enemy of the state because you won't bow your knee to the woke mob.
